AGM—Conservative Hall, East Preston 11th June 2013

With the Village Hall being fully booked with regular clubs and groups, this year, therefore the **AGM** is returning to the Conservative Hall, East Preston. Time 7.15pm.

To ensure that all residents are aware of certain AGM protocols we would remind you that if you wish to have any subject included in the AGM or wish to propose any resolution, details must be made in writing (and received by Hobdens) at least 6 weeks prior to the date of the AGM., this being no later than **Monday 29th April 2013**. In terms of a resolution this must be supported

by at least 10 paid up members and you must include the full names and addresses of the residents who are supporting your resolution, otherwise it can not be included.

We would urge all residents to attend the AGM.

If a vote is required on any subject you need to make sure that you are represented in any decisions taken.

During the informal part of the meeting we will deal first with any questions which residents have raised in advance. If you have any subject you wish to be included in the discussions if you could please

write in to Hobdens, this will ensure inclusion. The floor will then be opened for remaining questions.

We would encourage you to support the estate by coming along to this important annual meeting. Without your attendance we can find ourselves in the situation that the minority can make and influence a decision which affects the majority!

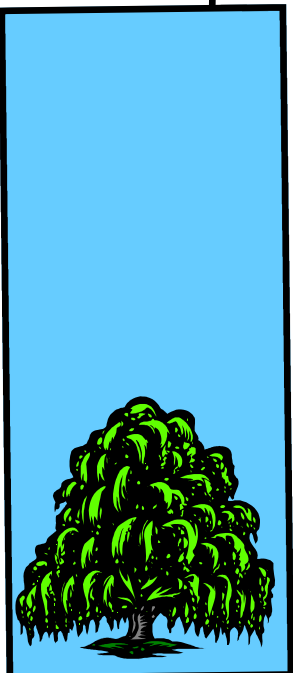

Parking Permit Logo

Some residents have queried the parking permit logo which has been placed on the new entrance signs and questioning why the board has done this.

For those residents that are not aware, we are not permitted to wheel clamp illegally parked vehicles. The new legislation permits something called Parking Charge Notices "PCN" to be issued. For us to be able to put a parking notice on an illegally parked vehicle we have to display the Parking Permit Logo on all entrances. The signage requirement for a

parking permit does not mean that residents will find themselves receiving a PCN, but means that should we experience problems with non residents parking on the estate, they can be fined; as they will not have a valid parking permit!

The markings on this logo are all as required by the current legislation.

This signage does not replace anything which may be connected to the covenants of the estate and has been introduced purely to stop the



"day tripper" parking. You will have noticed that the roadway signs have been replaced to represent these changes.

At approximately 8pm Wednesday 27th February occupants of a property in Gorse Avenue, Kingston disturbed 2 persons breaking into their house. In neighbouring Ferring, during the week ending 3rd March, there were 2 break-ins to properties, one suspected break-in and one attempted break-in. It is not known if the Kingston attempt is linked

to any of the incidents in Ferring.

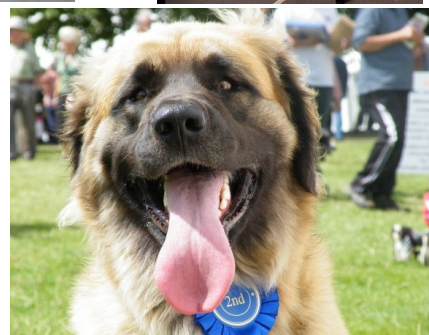
